USE: with COUNTABLES in Singular.
Example: There is A plum.
There is AN apple.

A - AN

The difference between A and AN

A and **AN** have the same meaning. A and **AN** are indefinite articles. The difference depends on the sound at the beginning of the next word.

When the next word starts with a
CONSONANT SOUND

A

When the next word starts with a
VOWEL SOUND

AN

BE CAREFUL! The **SOUND** of the letter is important

a house BUT an hour

The **H** at the beginning of **hour** is **silent**.

an uncle BUT a university

The **U** at the beginning of **university** sounds like **YOU**.

This rule applies to all words after **A** or **AN** (including adjectives, adverbs...)

a cold day

an easy lesson

a very crazy person

an interesting class





USE: With Countables and Uncountables in AFFIRMATIVE sentences.

Example: There is **SOME** sugar.
There are **SOME** apples.

SOME vs ANY

SOME



- Used to mean "a little" and "a few".
- Used with both countable and uncountable nouns.
- Used with countable nouns, nouns are plural, used with uncountable nouns, they are always singular.

Examples

- I must withdraw **some** money from the bank.
- Lyn sent **some** pictures from the wedding.
- He has bought **some** tropical fruits.


ANY

- Used to mean "no" or "zero".
- Used with both countable and uncountable nouns.
- Used with countable nouns, they are always plural, used with uncountable nouns, they always become singular.


Examples

- The baby can't keep **any** food down.
- You can't go out without **any** shoes.
- I won't give her **any** more if she's ungrateful.






